Putting into practice our 'Talking about faith' training

Back in September, a number of us gathered to prayerfully consider and discuss a number of questions that (depending on the conversation) we might use to open up conversations about Jesus in, given the increasing openness in society to talk about what excites us, including faith.

From "What have you been up to this week(end)?" through "Is there anything that (other) Christians have that you wish you had?" and "What do you like most about Jesus? What difference does he make in your life?" to "On a scale of 1-10, how confident are you that you will go to heaven? And why that number?" we considered what others might say and how we might lovingly respond whilst praying for the Holy Spirit's work.
